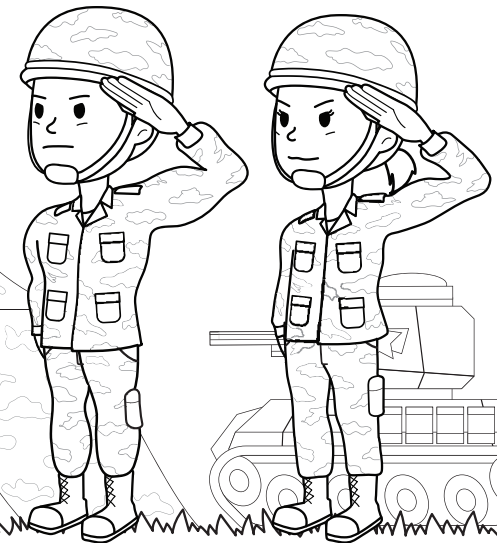
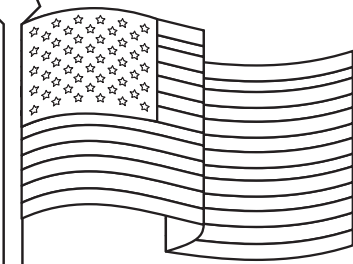
Fun Facts about our Flag

Flag of 1776



1. Our flag is a representation of independence.
2. The 13 stripes represent the original 13 colonies.
3. A man named Francis Bellamy wrote the Pledge of Allegiance in 1892.
4. the flag's colors are red, white and blue.
 - Red represents Valour.
 - White represents Liberty and Purity.
 - Blue represents Justice and Loyalty.
5. Betsy Ross sewed the original American flag in 1776.
6. Nick names for the American flag are Old Glory, Stars and Stripes, and Star Spangled Banner.
7. The World's largest American flag is 505ftx225ft and weighs around 3,000lbs.
8. As the country began to grow so did the amount of states. As the number of states grew we began to add more and more stars.
9. Once a flag becomes unrepairable, it must be destroyed in a dignified manner such as burning it.
10. The flag is to be displayed from sunrise to sunset, the flag can be displayed for 24 hours if it is lit up at night.

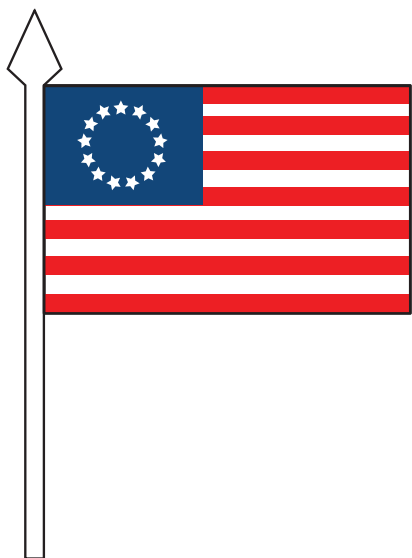
Present day flag

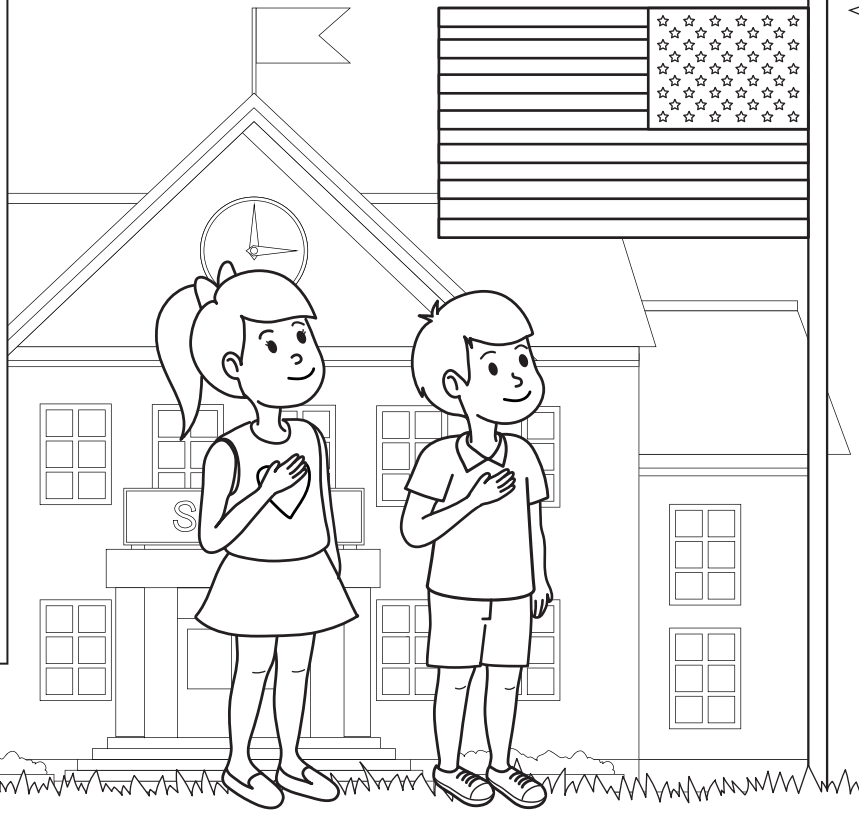
