The Statue of Liberty was built as a gift by French sculptor Frederic Auguste Bartholdi. It is to symbolize the welcoming for all immigrants and as well as a universal symbol of freedom. The female form represented by the sculpture is based on Libertas, the Roman goddess of liberty. She holds a torch in her right hand and a tablet that has the date of the American Declaration of Independence (July 4,1776) in her left hand. The official name of the Statue of Liberty is "Liberty Enlightening the World". The Statue of Liberty stands 151 feet in height and 305 feet from the ground to the torch.



The Kennedy Space Center was named after President John

F. Kennedy. The Kennedy Space Center is where NASA rockets are

launched and Space Shuttles take off and land. This site is known as
the hub for launch operations into space. The building was initially
supposed to be made from structural steel but as structural engineers
thought better on it and went with reinforced concrete for its acoustical
properties. Apollo 1, the first Lunar landing mission, on July 16, 1969
was launched at this station. On January 21, 2000 it was listed under
the National Register of Historic Places due to its importance on the
Apollo and shuttle programs.

The Liberty Bell is a symbol of America's independence. The bell was cast in England by a company now known as the Whitechapel Bell and ship to America. The bell cracked the first time it was rung and was then recast by John Pass and Joh Stow twice. The Liberty Bell weights approximately 2080 pounds and is made of 70% copper. The words engraved on the Liberty Bell across the top of the bell is , "Proclaim Liberty Throughout All the Land Unto All the Inhabitants Thereof". While there is no record that the Liberty Bell was rung, many believe it was rung when the Declaration of Independence was read on July 8, 1776



The White house was built to house the President of the


United States. An Irish architect James Hoban won the designed entry

The Golden Gate Bridge was built to connect the San Francisco


Peninsula with Marin County in order to decrease the traveling time

The Grand Canyon is 277 miles in length and at its widest point the Grand Canyon stretches 18 miles across. The Grand Canyon is around 6000 feet deep. The Colorado River runs through the Grand Canyon, it has been eroding its steep sides for millions of years. The rocks found at the bottom of the Grand Canyon (schist) is around 2 billion years old. American Indians have been living in and around the canyon for thousands of years.

Facts

Mount Rushmore National Memorial is a sculpture carved of 4

American Presidents, George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Theodore
Roosevelt, and Abraham Lincoln into the side of Mount Rushmore. It
took 14 years to finish this project and over 400 workers helped to
sculpt Mount Rushmore. About 800 million pounds of stone was
removed off the side of the mountain during construction.
