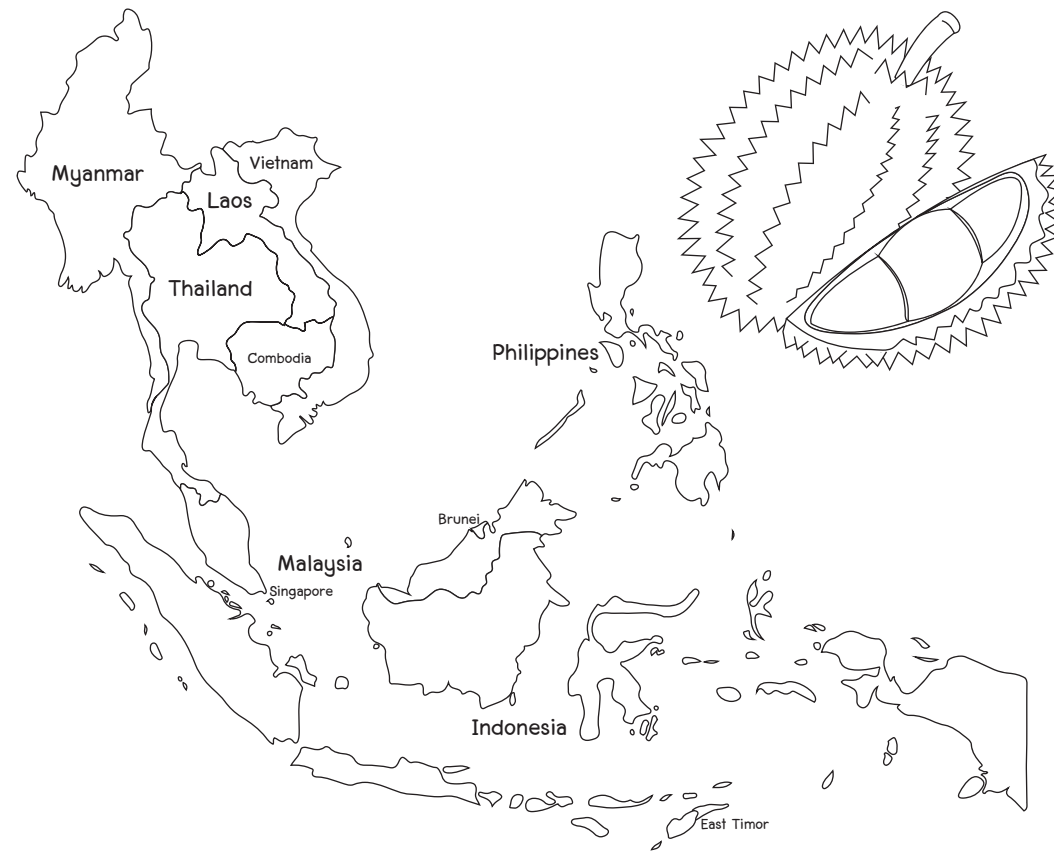

- The fruit contains black inedible seeds, which are poisonous.



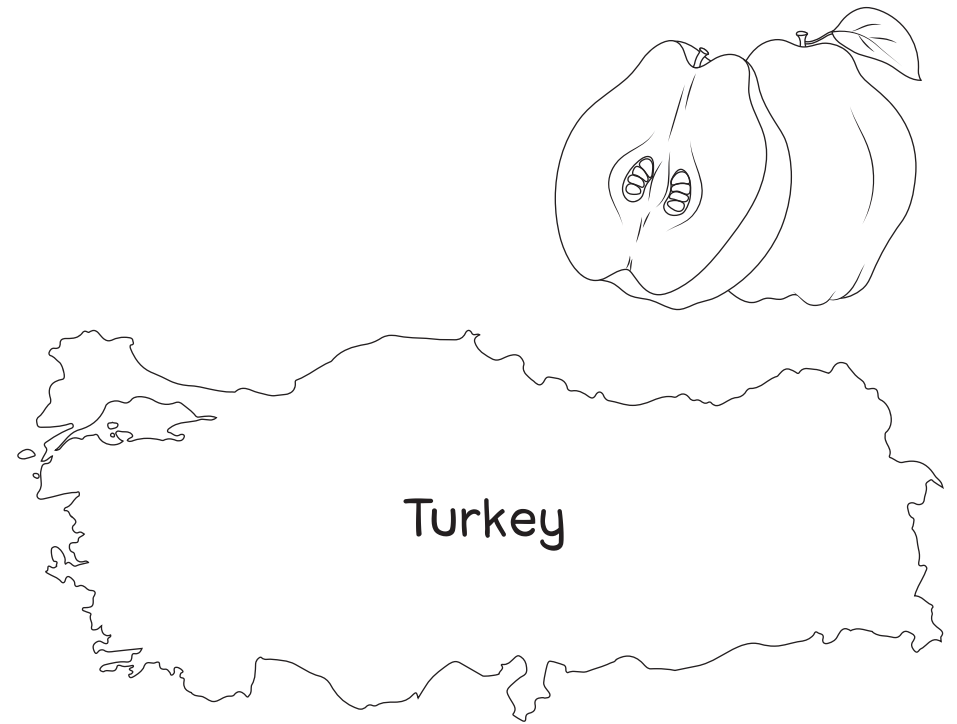
